## **Executive Summary**

Voter turnout for the 2026 Saitsa General Election was 7% with 1863 ballots cast. Fourteen candidates were listed on the ballot. Voting was conducted by way of Single Transferable Voting and it took fifteen rounds of counting to exhaust all votes and fill the nine positions.

Thirty-three nomination registrations were submitted with sixteen nominees meeting all eligibility requirements to become candidates. Two candidates withdrew from the election.

One slate was registered with nine candidates participating in the slate. Slate names appeared behind the candidate's name on the ballot with seven of the slate members elected to the Board.

Nominees were required to collect 10 endorsements from active Saitsa students as part of the nomination requirements.

Saitsa hosted several events and outreach opportunities throughout the election period to assist nominees in completing nomination requirements and assist candidates with their campaign promotion. Nominees were able to attend one of three different Candidates' Meetings scheduled over the nomination period. Candidates were invited to submit a candidate photo, profile and/or video to be posted on the Saitsa website. Candidates also had the option to participate in Meet & Greet which provided the candidates with direct engagement opportunities with the student voter base. Results Night was the final event where candidates and their supporters came together to hear the announcement of the provisional election results.

Significant changes were made to how and when candidates were able to campaign. Physical posting of campaign material anywhere on campus was no longer permitted, candidates campaigned without the assistance of campaign agents, and candidates were no longer able to campaign during voting days. This resulted in a significant drop in the number of valid complaints that were submitted this election with only informal warnings being issued and no valid appeals submitted.

The administration of this election was conducted in accordance with current Saitsa Election & Referenda Policies & Procedures, Bylaws, and Board Policies.

## Overview

This report will provide an overview of the election process, oversight, promotion, election periods, events, violations, voting, candidate expenses, and results.

## Election Process and Oversight

The Saitsa General Election is conducted each winter semester to elect the representatives for the board. The board consists of nine directors who will choose from within a President and Vice President.

Voting is conducted by way of Single Transferable Voting (STV). STV is a voting method where voters rank the candidates in order of preference from most preferred to least preferred on one ballot. Candidates are either elected to or eliminated from the election in several rounds of counting ballots until all positions have been filled. To be elected, candidates are to receive a minimum number of votes, which is the quota. The quota is calculated using the Droop formula; number of voters having cast a valid ballot divided by the number of options (number of director positions) plus one, and then adding one to this number. An independent third-party company, Simply Voting, processes the ballots, calculates the quota, and calculates the results. The CRO verifies the quota and the results prior to the provisional results being announced.

The CRO, assisted by the Governance and Advocacy staff, is responsible for administering Saitsa's elections and enforcing Saitsa's policies & procedures, reporting to the Chief Executive Officer. For convenience purposes, this group of individuals is referred to as the Election Committee.

The Election Oversight Panel (EOP) is an oversight body to the election process. The EOP consists of three disinterested parties appointed by the Chief Executive Officer. This panel exists independently and acts as an adjudication panel in the event of someone appealing the decision of the CRO or the election results.

Together the CRO and the EOP are in place to oversee the general conduct and implementation of elections on behalf of Saitsa in accordance with policies, and bylaws.

Election preparation for the 2026 Saitsa General Election began in the spring of 2025 with the CRO setting the preliminary election dates. The Manager of Governance and Advocacy worked on election promotion planning over the summer. In the fall the CRO and the Election Committee began working on reviewing existing election processes and updating them for the 2026 election. Election documents were reviewed and edits made as required.

Election promotion was conducted both on-campus and online beginning in January 2026 continuing through to the end of the election with the posting of election results. Social media posts, the Saitsa bulletin, and the Saitsa website were used to advertise all stages of the election process.

Saitsa provided optional election outreach opportunities to all candidates to assist with their election promotion. Candidates were able to submit a candidate photo, video, and/or profile that was posted on the candidate page on the Saitsa website as well as Saitsa tv monitors and Saitsa social media. Saitsa also hosted Meet & Greet, a one day in-person event, for candidates to meet and directly engage with voters.

## **Nomination Period**

Nominations were accepted from 9:00 a.m. on January 22, 2026, to 12:00 p.m. on February 11, 2026. The nomination process was broken down into different stages and nominees had to complete set eligibility requirements before advancing onto the next nomination stage. Attendance of a Candidates' Meeting was the final requirement in the nomination process for nominees to be confirmed as a candidate.

To be considered a candidate, students must be voting members of Saitsa who are active students in good standing and have paid their Saitsa and SAIT fees in full. They must submit a complete nomination package that includes the signing of a declaration agreeing to abide by the bylaws, election policies, and directives of the CRO. They have to obtain ten nomination signatures from Saitsa members and they must attend a Candidates' Meeting.

Three virtual Candidates' Meetings were held to accommodate student schedules; one on each of January 29, February 3, and February 11, 2026.

Thirty-three nomination registrations were submitted with sixteen nominees completing all eligibility requirements and qualifying to become candidates.

## **Campaign Period**

The Campaign Period ran from 9:00 a.m. February 12, 2026, to the close of voting at 3:00 p.m. on March 5, 2026. There were a few significant changes made to the campaign process for candidates to improve election processes and reduce the number of complaints. One to the timeline for when

candidates were permitted to campaign, one pertaining to how candidates were permitted to campaign, and one regarding the use of campaign representatives. Candidates were no longer able to actively campaign during the voting period. During the voting period campaign promotion was solely done by Saitso via Saitso's website, tv monitors and social media. In an effort to reduce the environmental impact of the election, candidates were no longer permitted to adhere campaign material to any surface on campus. Rather they were encouraged to promote via the Saitso website, social media, attend Meet & Greet, conduct classroom talks and hand out flyers. Campaign representatives were only allowed to assist candidates during Meet & Greet and not throughout the entire campaign period.

To assist candidates with their campaign, Saitso hosted events and outreach opportunities with the majority of the candidates choosing to participate. Campaign photos, profiles and videos submitted by the deadline of 12:00 p.m. February 24, 2026, were posted to the Saitso website and promoted on Saitso's social media to the close of voting at 3:00 p.m. March 5, 2026. Promotion of all candidates on Saitso's website allowed for one convenient location for Saitso members to access campaign information from all candidates. Meet & Greet was held on February 24, 2026, from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the Irene Lewis atrium. For this event, students were provided with a booth where they could engage directly with the student population to promote their campaign. Lower student attendance was noticed this year from previous years for this event. Fewer students staying on campus between classes combine with a convocation on campus that day is considered the likely reason for the decline in student attendance for Meet & Greet.

## **Complaints, Disciplinary Action, and Appeals**

The complaint process required complainants to submit their complaint through the submission platform on the Saitso website. Once the complaint was received the CRO opened a complaint file and if necessary sought further information to make an informed decision in determining if disciplinary action was required. If the CRO determined an election violation had occurred, the accused was notified in writing of the violation, advised what if any disciplinary action was being issued, and was directed to take corrective measures regarding the violation.

Disciplinary action that could be levied ranged from written warnings, monetary fines in the form of reductions to the amount of campaign expenses be reimbursed, to disqualification from the election. Several informal warnings were issued with no formal warnings or monetary fines levied this election. There were no disqualifications.

The appeal process required appellants to submit their appeal through the submission platform on the Saitso website. Appeals received by the Election Oversight Panel would be reviewed to determine if the appeal warranted a hearing. If a hearing was warranted, the Panel would commence the hearing process. No valid appeals were submitted to the EOP this election.

## Voting

Voting began at 9:00 a.m. March 2, 2026, and closed at 3:00 p.m. March 5, 2026. Students were sent an email with their secure link to access their ballot on the morning of March 2. Voters were able to cast their ballot at any time throughout the voting period on their personal devices.

Voting was conducted by way of Single Transferable Voting using the Droop Formula via Simply Voting, an independent third-party provider.

Very simply, with Single Transferable Voting, electors cast a ballot ranking their preferred candidates from most preferred to least preferred. The quota of votes is calculated using the Droop formula. Simply Voting calculates the formula and the CRO verifies the calculation. The quota of votes is calculated as follows:

In this example there are 1000 valid ballots cast for 9 board positions.

$$(1000 \text{ voters} / (9 \text{ board positions} + 1)) + 1 = 101$$

$$(1000 / 10) + 1 = 101 \text{ quota}$$

Candidates are elected or eliminated during rounds of counting votes. In order to be elected in a round of counting, a candidate must meet or exceed the quota of votes and must receive the highest number of votes. If no candidates receive the minimum number of votes to meet or exceed the quota of votes then the candidate with the least number of votes in that round will be eliminated. This will continue until all seats have been filled.

Voter turnout for the 2026 Saitsa General Election was 7% with 1863 Saitsa members submitting their ballots. Twenty-nine students abstained from ranking any of the candidates resulting in 1834 valid ballots cast. Based on 1863 valid ballots cast the quota was calculated to be 184. At the close of polls, the CRO verified the election results and confirmed the quota was correctly calculated by Simply Voting. To fill all nine positions on the board and exhaust all valid votes cast, it took fifteen rounds of counting.

## Results Night and Expense Forms

Candidates and their supporters were invited to attend Results Night on March 5 between 5:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. in MacDonald Hall where the provisional election results were announced. Election results became official at 3:00 p.m. on March 15, 2026, and results were posted on the Saitsa website on March 16, 2026.

Expense forms, along with all receipts, had to be submitted no later than 3:00 p.m. March 6, 2026. The CRO, assisted by the Chief Financial Officer, Governance and Advocacy Manager, and the Chief Executive Officer verified the expenses. All candidate expense forms were submitted on time.
